A Quick Guide to Online Resources for Patient Safety Organizations

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Both the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) and the Patient Safety Organization Privacy Protection Center (PSOPPC) provide resources for PSOs and users of AHRQ Common Formats. We have provided a summary of a few key resources below.

AHRQ Common Formats

AHRQ coordinates the development of Common Formats for reporting patient safety events to PSOs. In collaboration with the Federal Patient Safety Work Group (PSWG), AHRQ has developed Common Formats for four settings of care – acute care hospitals, nursing homes, surveillance, and retail pharmacy. Data Submission

The PSOPPC is now accepting patient safety event data from PSOs. Patient safety event data may be submitted by a PSO to the PSOPPC for nonidentification and transmission of the data to the Network of Patient Safety Databases (NPSD). The PSOPPC is accepting patient safety event data in the format outlined in the AHRQ Common Formats Version 1.1 and Version 1.2 Technical Specifications.

In addition to the above documents, a Data Dictionary for the Common Formats data elements is available from the PSOPPC Website Common Formats Technical Specifications page ([V1.1](#) and [V1.2](#)). The Data Dictionary defines the Common Formats data elements and their attributes (data element name and ID, answer codes and values, HL7 data type, Guide for Use, etc.)

Patient Safety and Quality Improvement Act of 2005 (Patient Safety Act): An Overview

The goals of the Patient Safety Act are to encourage the expansion of voluntary, provider-driven initiatives to improve the quality and safety of healthcare; to promote rapid learning about the underlying causes of risks and harms in the delivery of healthcare; and to share those findings widely, thus speeding the pace of improvement.
